DETAILS:	<p>Aim:</p> <p>To learn democracy</p> <p>Objectives:</p> <p>To enable young people to define democracy, to teach examples of democracy from life and to adopt democracy.</p> <p>Achivements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students' gaining democracy awareness • Realizing that democracy will ensure social order. <p>Related Vocabulary:</p> <p>history, democracy,Platon, society</p>
HOW TO USE THIS LESSON:	<p>Activities:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Transferring information to students about how democracy was born in the history of humanity, based on historical data by the teacher. 2. The teacher reads the text he created from his research to the students. He/she shares his/her own knowledge on this subject with the students. The teacher raises the awareness of the students about the development of democracy with informative texts. 3. Asking students to define democracy. 4. The teacher asks the students various questions: What is democracy? What do you understand by democratic practice? What social examples can you give about democracy in your environment? 5. Students answer the questions. The teacher gives feedback to the students upon the answers given. 6. The teacher reads Plato's definition of democracy.



	<ol style="list-style-type: none">7. Plato's definition of democracy in the relevant text is read by the teacher.8. Students' interpretation of the text.9. The teacher asks the students to interpret the text. Students share their ideas by commenting the text.10. The video in VAEIE project module is watched.11. The video about the topic is watched. Students and teacher exchange ideas about the video.
